Viva was born in Jacksonville to her mother and father in 1967. She graduated from Alden Road High School and moved to L'Arche Jacksonville in 1990.

From a young age, Viva had opportunities to socialize and grow thanks to her mother. Viva was involved in developmental dance therapy and thrived in ballet, tap, and tumbling classes. She was chosen to perform with Cyd Charisse (American dancer and actress) when she came to Love Grove Elementary for a visit. Knowing more about Viva's childhood, it makes sense that if you're playing songs she likes in the house, she will be the first one to get up and dance, fearlessly busting a move with the tunes!

When Viva was younger, she had the honor of playing piano with Arthur Fielder (Boston Pop Conductor). Along with being musically socialized, Viva also participated in Girl Scouts. Her mother started the first Girl Scout Troop for girls with disabilities and they would receive badges based on their abilities and gifts, creating an inclusive environment for young girls with different gifts. Her parents, especially her mom, were instrumental advocates working towards Viva's independence.

Today, Viva continues to thrive with her L'Arche family. She continues to make her own choices; becoming a member of the Catholic church, faithfully praying for everyone on her list every day, opening her own bank account at VyStar, and even taking care of her baby dolls Chad Francis, Ava Kayla, and Lulabelle.

Her infectious personality is remembered and adored by everyone she meets. Viva welcomes all and even remembers the date in which they arrived. Viva not only impacts individuals at L'Arche Jacksonville, but she motivates the greater Jacksonville community to do better. She continues to work at Pizza Hut, where she started working over 30 years ago, intricately folding boxes. After her work day is done and you've asked her how many boxes she folded that day, she always responds, "128 or 29, almost 130", showcasing her love for routine in her life and her dedication to her craft and community.



Traditions, stories and experiences are shared every day at L'Arche Jacksonville. Stories like the one from Viva's childhood when she mistakenly put her eyeglasses in the fish aquarium, or an experience of an Assistant sharing holiday traditions from their youth or country of origin. These memories that form a personality and a life, are passed on throughout the years, making each listener laugh or remark on the uniqueness of an individual life and character.
